

SUPPLEMENTARY CHAPTER 7: APPENDIX 7D – SPECIES LISTS

Summary of Target Notes (see Figure 7.2A attached to this Supplement)

- TN1: Former wood-pasture and parkland habitat (Enderby Park pLWS) as described at 7.3.18 of submitted ES
- TN2: Semi-improved grassland (“Parish level SINC: mown grassland”) as described at 7.3.20 of submitted ES and paragraphs 7.2.11 – 7.2.14 of the attached Supplementary Chapter 7.
- TN3: Semi-improved grassland (“Parish level SINC: Semi-improved grassland”)
- TN4: Semi-improved grassland (“District level SINC: Semi-improved grassland”)
- TN5: Semi-improved grassland as described at 7.3.21 of submitted ES and below
- TN6: Semi-improved grassland as described at 7.3.21 of submitted ES and below
- TN7: Enclosed area of tall herb and ruderal vegetation as described at paragraph 7.3.23 of submitted ES.
- TN8: Pond 4 supporting broadleaved pondweed and round-leaved water-crowfoot. The pond meets the criteria for selection as a Local Wildlife Site due to the presence of broadleaved pondweed. A full species list for the pond is provided within Appendix 7D, under Open Standing Water – P4, of the submitted ES.

Species lists

With the exception of those below, all species lists are as listed in Appendix 7D of the submitted ES.

Common bistort, a local Red Data Book species, was rarely recorded within the field margins close to New House Farm and also in the enclosed tall herb and ruderal field at TN7.

Semi-improved grassland TN5 and TN6

The following provides species lists for species poor semi-improved grasslands at TN5 and TN6 indicated on the submitted Figure 2 Phase 1 Habitat Plan as requested. These were omitted from the submitted Appendix 7D of the ES chapter 7 and are described, but not referenced, at paragraph 7.3.21 of the submitted ES Chapter.
